Physics of 5 Olympic Sports

Swimming- Olympic swimming races are often decided by tenths or hundredths of a second. Swimmers must do everything they can to reduce the water resistance against their body as they propel forward. Resistance will increase with the surface area exposed to the water, so the more streamlined a swimmer can make her body, the quicker she will go. The smoother the surface is, the better, as well, cover much of their bodies with specially designed swimsuits that mimic shark's skin or other surfaces for greater hydrodynamics. Swimmers must also think about buoyancy, the force that keeps them afloat. Because water is more resistant to movement than air, it is in athletes' best interests to swim as close to the surface as possible so that more of their bodies are exposed to the less resistant air than to the dragging water.



Gymnastics- All objects spinning around a point have a quantity called angular momentum that depends on the object's mass, speed and how spread out it is around its center of gravity. Unless some outside force interferes with the system, its angular momentum will be conserved. Thus, a gymnast can spin faster by pulling in his arms and legs as tightly as possible, thus reducing the space over which his mass is spread out. In response, the gymnast's speed will increase to make up the difference and keep his total angular momentum constant. Newton's third law of motion also plays a great role in gymnastics. Gymnasts take advantage of this by pushing hard against the floor, the balance beam or the vault, so that these surfaces push back hard against them, helping them lift into the air.

Diving-Olympic divers aim to do gorgeous twists and turns in the air, and then glide as seamlessly into the water as possible. The bigger the splash made going in, the larger the deduction taken from a diver's score. Divers also take advantage of Newton's third law. By jumping down on the diving board as hard as possible, divers can cause the board to push back up on them, giving them a larger vertical velocity to spring high into the air. The longer he is in the air, the more times a diver has to complete her somersaults.

Archery-Action and reaction play a significant role in archery as well. To shoot an arrow straight and true at a target, archers must first impart a forward force on it. To do this, an archer will pull back on the bow string, thus storing potential energy in the string. When the string is released, it imparts this potential energy to the arrow in the form of kinetic energy, propelling the arrow forward. Spin on the arrow, which can further improve its stability and accuracy by equalizing forces from air turbulence.

Badminton-Badminton is a racquet sport, where players pass a projectile called a shuttlecock or birdie, back and forth over a net. In contrast to spherical balls, shuttlecocks are balls with cones of feathers or nylon protruding from their sides, travel much differently through the air. Their feathers provoke a much larger drag force from air resistance, so they lose speed much more quickly than balls do. The feathers on a badminton shuttlecock improves its aerodynamic stability.

Thoughts move logic. Emotions move feelings. Motivation moves us in action.



A guest lecture was organized by the management of the college for the staff, on 4th June 2016. Prof. K. Nageshwar, editor of 'The Hans India', English daily, enlightened the staff about 'Leadership and Organization building.

'Leadership is management'- says Prof. K. Nageshwar . He pointed out the prominence of being an effective leader. As the quote says, "Leadership is not about position, but about action". E-Waste Management

An awareness program on Electronic Waste Management was organised by the Department of Electronics & Physics on 29th September, 2016 for B.Sc and B.Com students by Mr. Kashyap, Technical Manager, Earth Sense Resense Pvt. Limited, Hyderabad.

Technology is growing at a rapid pace and E-waste is the largest source of lead in solid waste. It is estimated that 70% of heavy metals in landfills come from E-waste. E-waste can contain more than 1,000 components, many of which are toxic, including brominated flame retardants, PVC, gases, heavy metals (lead, mercury, cadmium), and greater than 85% of all E-waste goes unrecycled. It's energy efficient



to rebuild old computers, but only about 2% of PCs ever find their way to a second user. About 50 millions cell phones are replaced worldwide a month, and only 10% are recycled. If just a million cell phones are recycled, it would reduce greenhouse gas emissions equal to taking 1,368 cars off the road for a year.

Mr. Kashyap explained about the definition of E-waste, importance of segregating E-waste from normal waste. He also explained the need for recycling E-waste and showed a presentation of various units available

A wild life stock department is a place where various birds and various animals are kept. It was a good opportunity for the students of second and final year BtMC students to visit the wild life stock department.

The professors of the department explained different techniques of animal breeding, molecular pharming methods and also showed the various equipments such as spectroscopy, distillation units, sterilization zone etc.,

The faculty of Animal husbandry showed the different breeds of buffaloes, goats, sheep, rabbits, pigs that are used in the animal biotechnology and also gave detailed description regarding the Azolla cultivation, used as a biofertilizer.

Importance of DNA isolation and PCR in Genetics and Biotechnology

Reliability of genotyping is an issue for studies using non-invasive sources of DNA. The importance of refining DNA extraction methods to maximize reliability and efficiency of genotyping for such DNA sources. Polymerase chain reaction (PCR) is often considered as one of the most important scientific advances in the field of molecular biology. With this revolutionary yet inexpensive biochemical technology, it's possible to generate millions of DNA copies from a single strand of DNA. As a result of this, PCR is considered to be one of the most indispensable techniques used in medical and biochemical research laboratories. Polymerase chain reaction, or molecular photocopying as it is lovingly called by some people, can be used in a variety of applications. DNA copies produced through PCR amplification can be used in a large number of medical and forensic applications.

Dr. A. Sandhya, Assistant Professor, Department of Genetics and Biotechnology delivered an interesting lecture on importance of Genomic DNA isolation, Polymerase Chain Reaction and their wide applications in various fields.

DNA ISOLATION AND PCR AMPLIFICATION

DNA (Deoxyribonucleic acid) supplies genetic information which determines what kind of creature and what characters would be formed in any living organism. Deoxyribonucleic acid is a self-replicating material present in almost all living organisms as the main component of chromosomes. DNA isolation is one of the most basic and essential techniques in the study of DNA. The extraction of DNA from cells and its purification are of primary importance in the field of biotechnology and forensics. Extraction and purification of DNA are the first steps in the analysis and manipulation of DNA that allow scientists to detect genetic disorders, produce DNA fingerprints of individuals, and even create genetically engineered organisms that can produce beneficial products such as insulin, antibiotics, and hormones.

The isolation of DNA is one of the most commonly used procedures in many areas of bacterial genetics, molecular biology and biochemistry. Purified DNA is required for many applications such as studying DNA structure and chemistry, examining DNA-protein interactions, carrying out DNA hybridizations, sequencing or PCR, performing various genetic studies or gene cloning. In this regard Department of Biotechnology, Little Flower Degree college has conducted a one day national work shop on isolation of genomic DNA on 24th January 2017 .We invited the eminent speaker Dr .Grace Prabhakar, faculty, Department of Biotechnology, St. Joseph's college, Bangalore to enlighten students on the significance of DNA extraction and PCR amplification.

THE VALUE OF READING LITERATURE

A symposium was organized at EFLU (English and Foreign Language University) on 28th June 2016, on "The Value of Reading Literature". The guest speakers, Prof. Sumita Roy, Prof. Prafulla Kar, Prof. Mohan Raj and Dr. Amith Kumar, elaborated on reading good literature. The epics *Ramayana and Mahabharata*, the Arthashastra, etc, were cited as examples of the literary origin. Prof. Sumita Roy stressed on "*The Bhagvad-Geetha*" more as a manual than as a scripture. She also



explained the term "SthithaPragnya" as an example of stress management i.e. the concept of balance. Prof. Sumita Roy also briefed on *Kavya and Katha* and also discussed the three Gunas - *Rajas, Tamas* and *Satthwik*. She also highlighted the folk tradition and the Bhakti Movement that gave rise to the "*Dohas*".

Prof. Kar later elaborated on "What does Literature do in the aspect of comparison". He expressed that it helps to devaluate the self, making one to understand the other. Comparative Literature brings out decontextualization and disagreement with the other. Speaking about Multi-Lingual conditions, he mentioned "Moby Dick" for its multi language that comprehends linguistic diversity.

Prof. Mohan Raj mentioned that the value in literature itself is very intrinsic. He stressed on 'arousing one's sense of curiosity to value literature'. He explained, if one is able to remember the lines of any prose or poetry, there itself it shows the value of literature and a sense of curiosity for it. "One needs the sensibility to feel literature", he exclaimed. He quoted Erick Chock, "Literature is a way to understand life, to appreciate living and therefore to participate in life to the fullest of your potential".

Dr. Amith Kumar lectured on how literature is taught. He insisted to focus on appreciation, as it exhibits a skill of higher order thinking. "Language competence and its use is subsumed, hence material must be authentic. Anything written with no tacit intentions, makes it unfamiliar to one, till it becomes relevant", said Prof. Kumar.

The session concluded with discussions on how students must develop the habit of reading good literature.

The Graphic Novel

Prof. Pramod. K. Nayar teaches at the Department of English, University of Hyderabad. He authored various books like 'Citizenship And Identity In The Age Of Surveillance', 'Posthumanism', 'The Edited Collections Of Women In Colonial India', 'Historical Documents, etc.

Prof. Nayar elucidated that a graphic novel is a narrative which is blend of text and pictures, often in a comic strip form. Prof. Nayar holds expertise in genres like comics & graphic novels, literary criticism and social sciences. He authored the book named 'The Indian Graphic Novel', which is a detailed study of South-Asian literature. This genre involves history, memory and cultural identity and its critique of the nation in the form of dissident histories and satires.

In his discourse he cited various examples of graphic novels viz. 'Bhimayana' (incidents in the life of Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar) by Srividya Natarajan et.al and illustrator Durgabai Vyam and 'A Gardener in the Waste land'(Jyotiba Phule's Fight for liberty) by Srividya Natarajan and illustrator Aparajita Ninan, and other such novels. The session was absolutely edifying and useful.

Dr. K. Durga Bhavani highlighted the essential elements for being an effective class room teacher with respect to English communication. In order to train students in different skills, a teacher must practice and gain expertise in all aspects. She elucidated on written and spoken communication. Writing helps to observe, remember, think, plan the work, organize and avoid stress. In order to improve efficiency in writing one must make a use of diary and record interesting thoughts and be updated. While giving these inputs ,she stressed on practicing - write, revise, edit and redraft.

Spoken communication requires good preparation and presentation. The choice words used for the target audience must be mindful. To be appropriate, chronological sequence, prioritizing the most important to the less important, etc are the ways of organizing information under this communication. Dr. Bhavani also concentrated the non- verbal communication, i.e. body language and facial expressions; Voice and eye-contact. This kind of communication also has a greater impact on the listeners(students). The discourse was developmental, where the teacher fraternity could implement all the inputs shared by the guest speaker.

Recent Advances in Fluid Mechanics

The Department of Mathematics, Osmania University, Hyd organized a 2-day National Conference on Recent Advances in Fluid Mechanics from May 30th to 31st 2016. The aim of the conference was mainly to acquire knowledge and ideas regarding latest techniques in applied mathematics.

Fluid dynamics is a branch of fluid mechanics and algorithm to solve and analyze problems involving fluid flows as well as the interaction of solids and other multi physics studies. One of the most challenging tasks in advanced fluid dynamics is the generation of structured or unstructured body fitted grids around complex geometries. The grid is used to discretize the governing equations in space and for this most efficient tools such as MATHEMATICA, MATLAB, COMSOL etc are widely used for solving the problems and better designs.

The conference mainly highlighted on

1. Homotopy Analysis
2. Spectral methods
3. Perturbation technique
4. Nonlinear ordinary differential equation
5. Heat transfer analysis through fins
6. Successive linearization techniques

Certain Types Of Numbers and their Applications

Mr G. Upender Reddy, Assistant Professor of Nizam Degree & P G College gave a lecture on different types of numbers for BSc I years. He gave definitions of different types of numbers we have.

He explained different types of the numbers formed by unique patterns that are often used in the solution of Mathematical problems. When distinct patterns are applicable, the first ten numbers of the patterns will be given along with specific relationships, or equations, that will enable us to find any number in the pattern.

He explained about Golden ratio, Fibonacci numbers, Hardy – Ramanujan, Quasi Perfect , relatively prime , Transcendental numbers etc.

Mr. Sethu Madhava Rao a retired Associate Professor of Kakatiya Govt College, Hanumakonda gave a lecture on "Fermat's Last Theorem" for B Sc II & III years. He gave a brief description about Pythagorous theorem, Pythagorous triplets & Fermat's theorem. Fermat wrote an equation $X^n + Y^n = Z^n$ and had no solution for $n > 2$. Fermat's last theorem stood unsolved in mathematics for the three and half centuries. It is one of the most unsolved problems of mathematics.

After the death of Fermat it was discovered that he proved the condition for $n = 4$ & X, Y, Z are 3,5,7. Later Sophie German proved for primes less than 100. Ernst Kummer extended and proved for regular primes. Atlast Andrew Wiles at the age of 10 encountered Fermat's Last theorem and received numerous prizes and also Abel's prize for 2016. It was listed in the Guinness Book Of Records as the most difficult mathematical problem.

Role of Mathematical Sciences in Digitalization

"Role of Mathematical Sciences in digitalization" – A two day workshop based on the role of Mathematics in digitalization was held on 7th & 8th September 2016 by the Department of Sciences at St Joseph's Degree & PG college. The main purpose of this workshop was to make students aware of the use of Math in digitalization. The event was inaugurated by Prof P L Vishweshwar Rao, Principal of Arts & Social Sciences. On 7th September 2016 Prof V Kannan gave lecture on "Use of Topological Dynamics in three problems of Digitalization". Dr K Veerabhadra Rao gave lecture on "The importance of Statistics for Digital Communication". Prof V.S.S. Sastry, School of Physics, UOH lectured on "Computational Physics & application of Mathematical Techniques"

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

For the betterment of Faculty of LFDC, Department of Psychology has conducted a Faculty Development Program on 30th Dec 2016. The speaker for the day was Dr. Padmaja, Assistant Professor, UOH. She spoke on the topic "Understanding the Individual Differences". As part of this, she discussed about the Transactional Analysis and Communication which is a psychoanalytic theory and method of therapy wherein social transactions are analyzed to determine the ego state of the patient as a basis for understanding behavior. Transactional analysis, developed by psychiatrist Eric Berne, is a form of modern psychology that examines a person's relationships and interactions. According to Berne, an ego state is a consistent pattern of feeling and experience directly related to a corresponding consistent pattern of behavior. Berne defined three ego states that can be confirmed by observable behavior: the parent, adult, or child.

The Faculty were engrossed in listening to Dr. Padmaja's lecture as she was relating the classroom interactions and experiences with the theory. I am assured that the lecture helped the Faculty to know their personal ego states and the ego states of the students as well. I am also assured that this Program would guide the Faculty to understand the individual differences among themselves and the students.

Habits of Success

In order to encourage and motivate the first year students of all the groups (BA, BCOM, BTMC), the College management has organized a seminar. The speaker for the sessions was Bro Yuju Francis and Bro Yuju Francis is a trained psychological counsellor.

RESEARCH WORK- Survey

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
