From 2018-19, the institution established an entrepreneurship cell to promote an innovative ecosystem. The policy was revised again in the year 2023-24, as the institution seeks to further enhance its innovation capabilities and resources.

## 1. Objectives

- **Foster Innovation:** Encourage a culture of creativity and innovative thinking among students and faculty.
- **Promote Research and Development:** Support research activities that lead to innovative solutions to real world problems. Encourage interdisciplinary collaboration.
- **Build Industry Collaboration:** Strengthen partnership with industries to provide students with exposure to latest trends and technologies. This can lead to internships, projects and job placements that are aligned with the industry needs.
- **Foster a start-up ecosystem:** Create an environment that supports the incubation and acceleration of student lead start-ups, including providing access to mentorship, funding and resources.
- **Encourage Social Innovation:** Promote the development of solutions that address social and environmental challenges, ensuring that innovation benefits society as a whole.

## 2. Scope and Applicability:

### SCOPE:

## **3. Roles & Responsibilities:**

- Act as a primary body responsible for driving and monitoring innovative activities within the institution.
- Develop and implement and organise innovation related events, workshops and competitions.
- Facilitate collaboration between departments and external partners.
- Monitor the progress of innovation projects and report to the management.
- Guide students in research projects and entrepreneurship.

## **4. Compliance and Ethical Standards:**

- To ensure all research activities follow ethical guidelines related to data collection analysis and report making.
- To protect the rights and privacy of human subjects and research, obtaining informed consent where necessary.
- To avoid plagiarism and proper citation of sources in all research outputs.
- To respect intellectual property rights both within and outside the institution.
- To provide clear guidelines on the ownership of IPR created by students and staff.

## **5. Amends and Revisions:**

- To conduct a formal review of innovation policy at regular intervals to assess its effectiveness and relevance.
- Gather input from all stakeholders.
- Integrate relevant feedback into the policy amendments to ensure it meets the needs of the institution.
- Update the policy to reflect emerging trends in technology, innovation methodologies and industry demands.
- To ensure the previous version of the policy are archived and accessible for revision.
