## TEACHER'S DAY

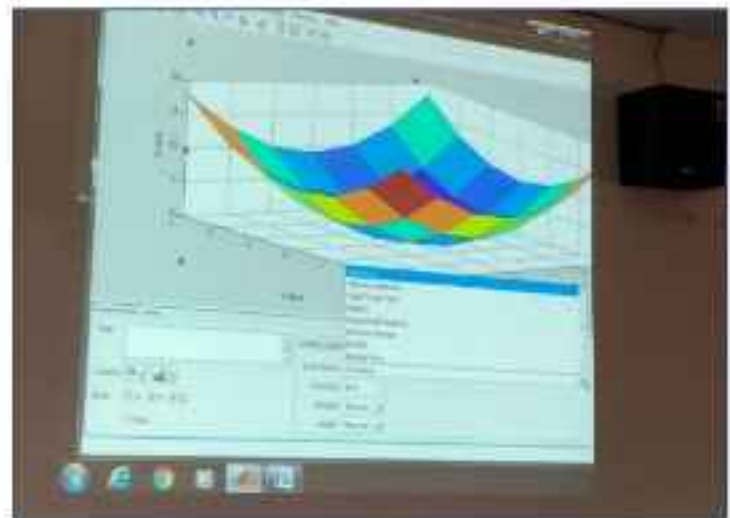

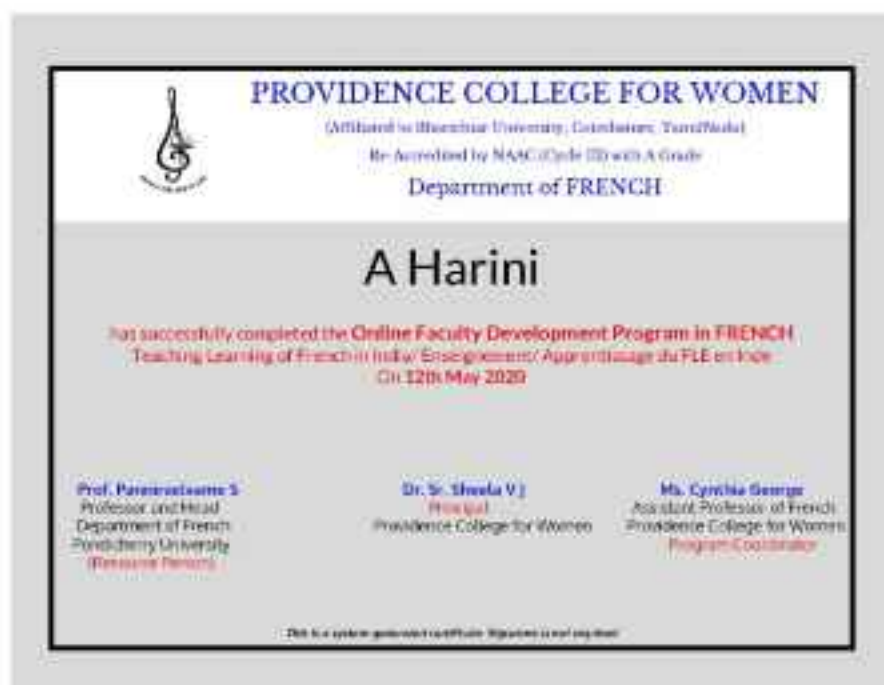
# ONLINE FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

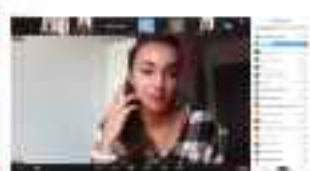
## ONLINE INTERNATIONAL INTERACTION SESSION

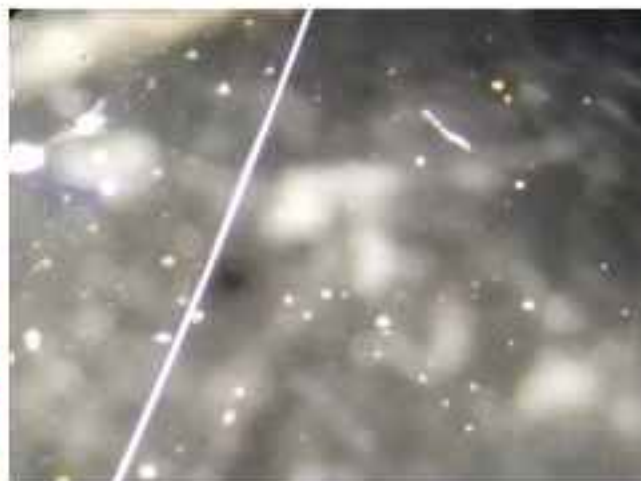

It may seem like large amounts of plastic waste are inevitable in the world we live in, but you can help with the plastic pollution issue by being aware of its dangers and taking steps to reduce waste. The amount of garbage in the world increases as the population grows, and disposable plastic products, like water bottles and soda cans, accumulate over time. Plastic pollution occurs when enough plastic has gathered in an area that it affects the natural environment and harms plants, animals, or humans. Plastic has toxic pollutants that damage the environment and cause land, water, and air pollution. It can take hundreds or even thousands of years for plastic to break down, so the damage to the environment is long-lasting. Overuse of plastic is the main cause of plastic pollution. Plastic is cheap and widely available, but people frequently dispose of plastic items. They don't decompose, and they release an incredible amount of toxins into the air if they're burned. Regular, everyday trash is one of the biggest contributors to plastic pollution. Milk cartons with plastic linings, disposable water bottles, soaps with small plastic beads, and other products end up in the environment or in dumps where they can affect the groundwater and nearby wildlife.

On 21st September 2019, The Department of Biotechnology and Microbiology in association with LENVIN which was assisted by our dedicated Teachers and members of LENVIN took an initiative of educating public about plastic pollution and distributing hand stitched cloth bags to the public in and around our college premises.





## LIFE ACTIVITY- EDUCATION

Immunisation describes the process whereby people are protected against illness caused by infection with micro-organisms (formally called pathogens). The term vaccine refers to the material used for immunisation, while vaccination refers to the act of giving a vaccine to a person.

Some Immunization facts:

1. Immunization saves 3 million lives every year.
2. More than 1 million infants and young children all over the world die every year from rotavirus diarrhoea and pneumococcal disease. Both of these diseases can be prevented through vaccination.
3. Immunization reduces mortality, morbidity, reduces direct and indirect medical costs.
4. Vaccination protects children from serious illness and complications of vaccine-preventable diseases.
5. Vaccine-preventable diseases, such as measles, mumps, and whooping cough, are still a threat.
6. If children aren't vaccinated, they can spread the disease to other children who are too young to be vaccinated or to people with weakened immune systems, such as transplant recipients and people with cancer. This could result in long-term complications and even death for these vulnerable people.
7. Vaccination is very safe and effective.
8. Vaccines have reduced and, in some cases, eliminated many diseases that killed or severely disabled people just a few generations ago. For example, smallpox vaccination eradicated that disease worldwide.
9. Getting immunized costs less than getting treated for the diseases that the vaccines protect you from.
10. If exposure to a disease occurs in a community, there is little to no risk of an epidemic if people have been immunized.

They come in tons of different shapes and sizes, and can take on many forms. Vertical gardening systems add structure and beauty to the garden, and give it tons of character. Plus they allow us to grow in spaces we never would be able to otherwise. When you start considering all of the different types of vertical gardens you could create, it will really open your eyes to a whole new way of thinking. There are many types of structures and supports you can use for growing plants vertically, and there's a lot of room for creativity. We used empty bottles of cold drinks for vertical gardening and planted some climbers as well as some seeds of coriander, fenugreek and spinach. Students from second year and final year BZC participated enthusiastically.

He also spoke about the functioning of start-ups in T-Hub. Approximately 160-170 start-ups have a physical presence in T-Hub. They are to pay a minimal amount for the facilities provided inside T-Hub. He also explained about the legalities the start-ups have to go through. They had also learned that T-Hub has connections with about 3000 start-ups. There was a reveal of the metaphorical factory that the building T-Hub is located in it's banned Catalyst. It has seemed apt for the organization that deals with business accelerating. The students had been fascinated by the functioning and policies of T-Hub.





## **FINAL YEAR PROJECT WORKSHOP**

Nagarjuna Sagar dam region, located in Nalgonda district of Telangana is home to some of the oldest Buddhist civilizations in India, where a vast number of historic coins and artifacts were discovered during the construction of the dam. On the way to the dam, we stopped at Buddavanam, which is renowned as the Buddhist Theme Park, close to the right bank canal of Nagarjuna Sagar dam towards Telangana side. The museum showcases an impressive display of Buddhist Sculptures, Tankas, Bronzes, Pala, Gandhara Sculptures, Ajantha Paintings and Stone

Sculptures. There are new galleries being added here for preserving timeless monuments and sculptures that depict the rich past heritage and glory of this region, which was once inhabited by Acharya Nagarjuna, one of the founders of the Mahayana Buddhism. Nagarjuna Sagar Dam is a masonry dam across the Krishna River, which straddles the border between Guntur district, Andhra Pradesh and Nalgonda district, Telangana. As the tallest masonry dam, it is also the pride of India and the project also boasts of the largest canal system network in India. As we took the boat ride, we enjoyed the beautiful landscape and strikingly scenic water body. Crossing the border in an Auto- Rickshaw was an adventurous journey, and felt peace and tranquility at the shrine of Sagar Maatha in the calm and serene atmosphere, the pilgrim center on the shore of river Krishna. From there we went to visit Nagarjunakonda,

a historical town, now an island located near Nagarjuna Sagar in Guntur district of Andhra Pradesh. It is one of India's richest Buddhist sites, and now lies almost entirely under the Nagarjunasagar Dam. It is named after Nagarjuna, a southern Indian master of Mahayana Buddhism who lived in the 2nd century. The site was once the location of many Buddhist universities and monasteries, attracting students from as far as China, Gandhara, Bengal and Sri Lanka. Finally, before returning we witnessed the enthralling Ethipothala waterfalls, a high river cascade, situated in Guntur district. The waterfall is a combination of three streams namely Chandravanka Vagu, Nakkala Vagu and Tummala Vagu. It is situated about 11km from Nagarjuna Sagar Dam. It was a day filled with loads of fun, learning, adventure, enjoying the beauty of nature and above all the fellowship that helped us to know each other better.

### **DAY 1 - SPORTS DAY FOR SCHOOL, JUNIOR AND DEGREE COLLEGE FACULTY: THROW BALL TOURNAMENT**



International Women's Day Celebrations Day 01: The impetus for establishing an International Women's Day can be traced back to New York City in February 1908, when thousands of women who were garment workers went on strike and marched through the city to protest against their working conditions. "Like today, these women were in less organized workplaces [than their male counterparts], were in the lower echelons of the garment industry, and were working at low wages and experiencing sexual harassment," says Eileen Boris, Professor of Feminist Studies at the University of California Santa Barbara.

In honor of the anniversary of those strikes, which were ongoing for more than a year, a National Women's Day was celebrated for the first time in the U.S. on Feb. 28, 1909, spearheaded by the Socialist Party of America. Led by German campaigner and socialist Clara Zetkin, the idea to turn the day into an international movement advocating universal suffrage was established at the International Conference of Working Women in 1910.

At Little Flower Degree College, the first day with its activities set off a chain of celebrations for the subsequent week for International Women's Day. It began with a sports day for the faculty of school, junior and degree college. A tournament of throw ball was conducted among the three faculties with 7 members per team judged by Ms. Kalyani and Ms. Varsha from Nizam College. This gave the teachers a chance to unwind from their daily schedules and showcase their additional skills. The day also saw unveiling of the schedule of the following week which brought with it a surfeit of the celebrations honoring and rejoicing the female gender.
