Saint Louis-Marie Grignion de Montfort (31 January 1673 – 28 April 1716) was a French Roman Catholic priest and Confessor. From the beginning of his priestly ministry in December 1700. Louis-Marie envisioned a Congregation ready to go anywhere to teach catechism to the peasants, the poor, and the children. Alone" was his motto and the source of his unending spring of love was always God. The Roman Catholic Church, under the pontificate of Pope Pius XII. canonized Montfort on July 20, 1947. Three congregations trace their foundation to St. Louis de Montfort: Daughters of Wisdom, Company of Mary, Brothers of St. Gabriel. Though the Montfortian Society was founded in the 18th century, it is only in 1903that the Brothers came to India

St Therese of Lisieux, born Marie Françoise-Thérèse Martin (2 January 1873 – 30 September 1897) was a French Catholic who became a Carmelite nun at an early age. She is popularly known as "The Little Flower of Jesus", or simply "The Little Flower". She died in obscurity at the age of 24. However, after her death, her autobiography – Story of a Soul was published and became a best-seller around the world. Her books explained her spiritual path of love and selflessness, and she became one of only three females to be considered a doctor of the Catholic Church. "What matters in life," she wrote, "is not great deeds, but great love." She loved flowers and saw herself as the "little flower of Jesus". Because of this beautiful analogy, the title "little flower" remained with her. St Therese was canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 17, 1925.

RULES AND CODE OF CONDUCT

The daily working hours of the college are from 8.15 a.m. to 1.50 p.m.

Students are expected to be in their classes before the bell. Attendance will be marked at each period. Late comers are not allowed.

Payment of exam fees is no guarantee that a student will be permitted to appear for the final exam. Permission for admission to University Examination will not be granted unless

- A student has put in a minimum of 75% of attendance during the academic year as per the regulations of the Osmania University.
- ii) A student gets the required pass marks/grade in the examination assignments conducted by the College as per the norms laid down by the College/University.
- iii) The Principal is satisfied with the character and conduct of the student.

The list of candidates falling short of attendance will be displayed on the College notice board every month. College expects 90% attendance from all the students.

EXAMINATIONS/TESTS

The college conducts Slip Tests, Mid Sem Examinations. Students are advised to take up exams seriously for improving their academic levels. Inspite of our best efforts to make students write their college exams, some have the habit of absenting, citing lame excuses. To create seriousness in the attitude of students towards exams, the absentees will be penalized for their absence.

Students failing to write the examinations conducted by the college should pay a fine of Rs.100/- per paper and take a re exam. This is done so as to inculcate in them the right discipline and examination culture and not for collection of fines.

EVALUATION PRACTICES

A. Assignments & Seminars

Select modules of courseware/related topics/concepts in each subject are given as assignments / seminars by faculty to make students research various sources, gather information, organize and perform cohesively.

B. Slip tests / Mid Sem tests

Each department has laid down an appraisal system to asses the performance of the students in the Slip Test and Mid Sem tests conducted.

C. Semester Exams

The student's performance in the Internal & Semester exams is a major index of his/her proficiency in each subject.

DRESS CODE

- Students are expected to come to College dressed neatly and decently following the dress code of the college.
