



Aryabhata


Dear Readers, this month I bring to you one of the luminaries of ancient India, ARYABHATA, from the classical age. He is regarded as the 'Father of Indian Mathematics.' India's first satellite in 1975 was named after this great mathematician and astronomer.

ARYABHATA -476 AD -550 AD

Aryabhata was an ancient Indian mathematician and astronomer whose significant contributions to the fields of mathematics and astronomy are colossal. He was born in present-day Patna, in Bihar, in Kusumapura. He was a student at Nalanda University and received a thorough education in mathematics and astronomy. Aryabhata's most famous work is the 'ARYABHATIYA', a Sanskrit astronomical treatise in verse form that he compiled when he was 23 years old.

Aryabhata made significant contributions to the understanding of mathematics. He introduced the concept of zero as a placeholder and gave a place-value system to the decimal numeral system. His work laid the foundation for the development of algebra and trigonometry in India. He also proposed a heliocentric model of the solar system where the earth revolves around the sun. He accurately calculated the length of the solar year as 365.358 days, very close to the modern value. He also calculated the value of (pi) to several decimal places and provided methods for calculating the position of celestial bodies.

His work had a profound impact not only in India but also in the Islamic world and Europe. His ideas influenced later astronomers and mathematicians, including Brahmagupta and Bhaskara. His findings led to the advancement of mathematics and astronomy in the Islamic and European worlds.

15-Minute Garlic Shrimp Spaghetti

This quick and easy garlic shrimp spaghetti features shrimp and pasta tossed in a garlic butter sauce to have your tastebuds dancing with joy. Best of all, this light and delicious pasta is so incredibly simple to make.



INGREDIENTS

1/2 lb. Large shrimp
7 oz. Spaghetti or your choice of long pasta
2 tablespoons olive oil
2 tbsp. Butter
6 cloves of garlic, thinly sliced
1 tsp. Crushed red pepper
2 tbsp. Chopped fresh parsley
Lemon juice,
parmesan cheese optional, for garnish

INSTRUCTIONS

Season the shrimp with salt and pepper.

In a large pot of boiling salted water, cook the pasta. Reserve about a cup of pasta water and drain the pasta.


While the pasta is cooking, melt 1 tablespoon of butter in a pan and add the shrimp. Cook for about 2–3 minutes. Remove it and set it aside.

In the same pan, melt 1 tablespoon of butter and mix in the olive oil. Add the garlic, cook, and stir in the red pepper flakes.

Add pasta and ½ cup of pasta water, and toss well to combine. Add shrimp, and season with salt to taste.

Once the pasta is tender, remove from heat and mix in the parsley. Garnish and enjoy!



Daasashreshta Kanakadasa, who lived between 1509 and 1609, was a philosopher and Haridasa saint, known popularly as Kanaka Dasa.He was a devotee of Lord Sri Krishna. He was a great Carnatic music composer in Kannada. His childhood name was Thimmappa Nayaka. He was born in 1509 to Biregowda & Beechamma in Baada Village, near Bankapura in Karnataka. He belonged to the warrior community, and his defeat in the battle directed him to choose the path devotion. He is the disciple of Vyasaraja, who was also the guru of the famous Carnatic music composer Purandaradasa. 240 composed carnatic compositions, which comprise kirtane, padas, and philosophical songs. He wrote five important like major works. Haribhaktisara, Nrisimhastava, Ramadhanyacharithe, Mohanatarangini, Nalacharithe. He also wrote 100 songs in Kannada and 60 songs in English.






