PRESS FREEDOM: PREREQUISITE FOR A HEALTHY DEMOCRACY

On May 3, 2023, the UNESCO is planning to organise a special anniversary event at UN headquarters in New York, marking the 30 years since the UN General Assembly's decision proclaiming an international day for press freedom.

Countries have acknowledged Freedom of Expression as a prerequisite for the enjoyment of other human rights. Years when journalism served democracy as its fourth pillar, are long gone. Raids on media houses, arresting journalists who criticise the government, and buying subservience with money, can all be seen as deliberate moves to contaminate and disregard a noble profession that once told the truth to the ones in power.

India was placed at 142nd rank in the World Press Freedom Index in the year 2021 and had sunk to 150th rank last year. The violence against journalists, politically partisan media, and increasing corporate ownership are the reasons for the decline.

India, which is considered the largest democracy, needs a course correction. It is high time we as citizens of this country stand up for this noble profession. Irresponsible journalism increases polarisation and amplifies division within countries. This World Press Freedom Day, let's hope the journalists are freed from these divisive and destructive forces to carry on with their relentless work in a responsible manner.

VERNACULAR VIEW मेरा अनुभव

मेरा दृढ़ विश्वास है कि अनुभव किसी के व्यक्तिगत विकास में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाता है। मुख्य रूप से दो प्रकार के अनुभव होते हैं लेकिन लोग प्रमुख रूप से केवल एक को प्राप्त करने पर ध्यान केंद्रित करते हैं। पहले प्रकार का अनुभव सैद्धांतिक अनुभव है, जिस पर हम सभी अधिकतर ध्यान केंद्रित करते हैं लेकिन अनुभव प्राप्त करने का दूसरा तरीका व्यावहारिक अनुभव है। दोनों प्रकार के अनुभव एक ही सिक्के के दो पहलू हैं। अपने निकाले गए निष्कर्ष को सिद्ध करने के लिए मैं अपना व्यक्तिगत अनुभव साझा करना चाहूंगा। हाल ही में मैंने प्रबंधन के एक प्रसिद्ध क्षेत्र में रुचि प्राप्त की है जो मानव संसाधन(HR) है, मानव संसाधन के बारे में पढ़ना, सीखना, और जानना मुझे पसंद है और मुझे हमेशा आश्चर्य होता है कि प्रबंधन का यह क्षेत्र व्यावहारिक दुनिया में कैसे कार्य करेगा, यह जानने के लिए मैंने भारत की जानी-मानी हेल्थ होम केयर कंपनी पोर्टिया मेडिकल में इंटर्नशिप प्रोग्राम में दाखिला लिया। मैं एक अकेला इंटर्न था जिसे इंटरव्यू के तीन दौर के बाद चुना गया था और मुझे अपने इंटर्नशिप कार्यक्रम के दौरान कोलकाता शाखा में एचआर पर्यवेक्षक को रिपोर्ट करने को निर्देशित किया गया था। अपने इंटर्नशिप के दौरान मैंने एचआर द्वारा रिक्रूट्मैन्ट् और ऑनबोर्डिंग में उपयोग की जाने वाली विभिन्न तकनीकों को सीखा है। दूसरी महत्वपूर्ण बात जो मैंने अपनी इंटर्नशिप अवधि के दौरान विकसित की है, वह यह थी कि कर्मचारियों के दस्तावेज एक महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाते हैं, ऐसे कई दस्तावेज हैं जो एचआर विभाग के सुचारू कामकाज में मदद करते हैं। फॉर्म के कुछ उदाहरण जो मैंने देखे हैं वे हैं आवेदन फॉर्म, पी.एफ और ई.एस.आई फॉर्म, नो ड्यू क्लीयरेंस फॉर्म, नियम और शर्तें फॉर्म और आदि। एचआर की अन्य विशेषता जो मैंने अपनी इंटर्नशिप के दौरान देखी है वह यह थी कि एचआर को सिर्फ अपने विभाग से ही नहीं है अपितु संगठन से जुड़े प्रत्येक कर्मचारी के साथ संबंध बनाने की आवश्यकता है क्योंकि एचआर बन्ना पारस्परिक संचार कौशल की मांग करता है। एचआर के कुछ कार्यों को निष्पादित करते समय प्राप्त अनुभव को शब्दों में विस्तृत नहीं किया जा सकता है, लेकिन मैं यह अवश्य कह सकता हूं कि मेरे लिए एचआर केवल एक प्रोफेशन नहीं है अपितु असरदार कर्मचारियों का सुयोजित समूह का निर्माण करना है।







at the cost of her bondage


