












JOURNEY THROUGH GENERATIONS

Overall the session was very interactive and informative giving students a chance to showcase their talent.



Fact of the Month

Dogs can tell time by smell.

A dog's nose is a notoriously sensitive piece of equipment. With up to 300 million olfactory receptors compared to our 5 million, a dog can detect a single teaspoon of sugar dissolved in a million gallons of water, the equivalent of two Olympic-sized swimming pools.

Unlike us, dogs are able to take in scent continuously, even as they exhale. What's more, a dog's nostrils are smaller than the distance between them, effectively giving dogs' 'Stereo' sniffing that carries subtle grades of information, including directionality.

Shyama Shastri


Shyama Shastri, who was born to the Telugu Brahmin family, Vishwanatha Iyer and Vengalakshmi, on April 26, 1762, in Tiruvarur, Tamil Nadu, and whose birth name was Venkata Subrahmanya, He is one of the oldest popular trios of classical music; the other two were Tyagaraja and Muthuswami Dikshitar. He learned the basics of classical music, but he also learned the Vedas and astrology from his maternal uncle.

Later, he learned the music from the Durbar musician of Thanjavur, i.e., Adiyappa. Shyama Shastri composed a very small number of kritis, about 300, but most of them were famous in Indian classical Carnatic music compared with other famous musicians. He worships the goddess Kamakshi, and most of the kritis are written in Tamil. He created Navaratnamalika, which consists of nine kritis in Madhurai. He is called the creator of Sarajati, usually a dance form, but afterwards it has been turned into a song form by removing the jatis.

He composed most of the songs in Telugu and a few in Sanskrit, as well as Tamil.Without nodding his head, he can render his classical music in swarajatis.Disciples of Shyama Shastri: Subbaraaya Shaastree, Taarangamba Di Pancanaatayyar, and Alasur Krishnayaar He composed 47 compositions in 29 ragas that are available today.

He died in the year 1827, on February 6th.





Dear Readers, this month I bring to you 'The Light of Asia', whose remarkable life has been a beacon of light and a ray of hope to the restless souls yearning for contentment and salvation. This is the story of Siddhartha Gautama, a prince turned spiritual leader and the founder of Buddhism.

GAUTAMA BUDDHA-564 BC-486 BC

Gautama Buddha, one of the most exceptional of free thinkers, social reformers, and religious leaders, was born as Prince Siddhartha and was surrounded by beauty, luxury, and happiness. He was born in Lumbini, located in present-day Nepal. He was the son of King Suddodhana and Queen Maya of the Sakya dynasty. A prophecy at his birth foretold that he would either become a great king or a great spiritual leader. Fear gripped his father, and a sheltered life of comfort and opulence was led by Siddhartha till the age of 29. At that age, he encountered four sights that changed his life forever. He encountered an old man, a sick person, a corpse, and a wandering ascetic, which disturbed Gautama deeply and made him realize the inevitability of suffering and the impermanence of life. Fueled by a strong desire to understand the nature of suffering and find a path to alleviate It, Siddhartha renounced his princely life, leaving behind his young wife and infant son. He embarked on a journey of self-discovery as an ascetic, seeking answers about life, death, and suffering from various gurus but could not find a satisfactory answer. Later, Siddhartha practiced severe austerities for several years but found no satisfaction in extreme self-mortification. He decided to meditate under the Bodhi tree in Bodh Gaya, present-day Bihar. After years of meditation, he achieved enlightenment at the age of 35. He became a BUDDHA, which means 'the awakened one' or 'the enlightened one'. Following his enlightenment, Buddha travelled to Sarnath, Varanasi, and delivered his first sermon, known as 'DHAMMACAKKAPPAVATTANA SUTTA' or the 'Turning of the Wheel of Dharma'. In this sermon, he outlined the 'FOUR NOBLE TRUTHS' - There is suffering in the world; The cause of suffering is attachment or desire; The suffering can be conquered; Desire can be conquered by following the eight-fold path, or 'EIGHTFOLD PATH'. In the next several decades, Buddha traveled across northern India, teaching the Dharma and gathering a community of followers known as the Sangha. He attracted people from all walks of life, including kings, ascetics, and commoners. At the age of 80, after a long and fruitful life of teaching and spiritual guidance, Buddha passed away in Kushinagar, India. His death is known as parinirvana, which signifies his complete liberation from the cycle of birth and death (samsara). Gautama Buddha's teachings laid the foundation for Buddhism, which continues to be a major world religion with millions of followers around the globe. His emphasis on the alleviation of suffering and the pursuit of enlightenment through mindfulness and right conduct has had a profound and lasting impact on the world
