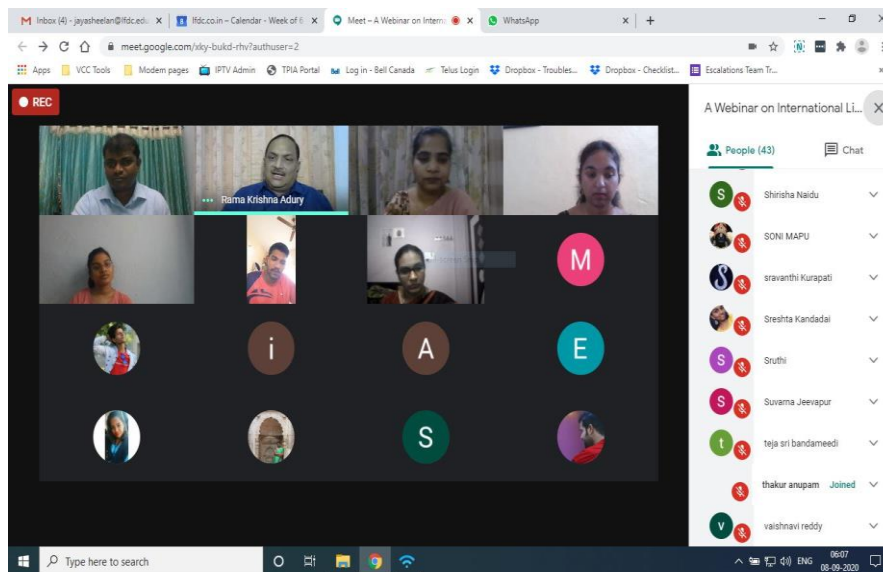

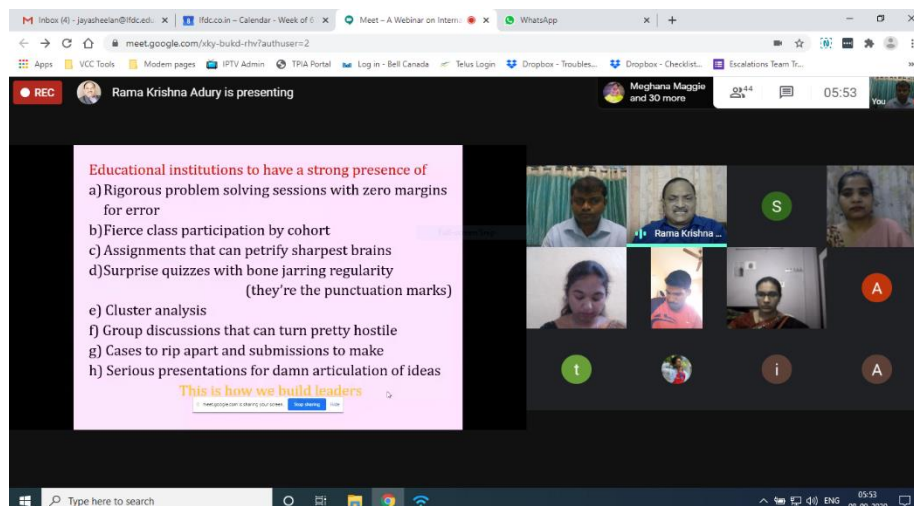

WHO WAS SHAKESPEARE?

- 37 plays are attributed to him, but there is great controversy over the authorship
- Some claim many authors wrote under one name
- In Elizabethan England, one could spell their name any way they wished, including changing it from day to day, which led to much confusion.
- Shakespeare's name has been spelled in over 80 different ways, including *Shagspeare*, *Shaxpere*, & *Shakestaffe*, just to name a few.

Life


- By 1762 Goldsmith had established himself as an essayist with his '*Citizen of the World*'
- By 1764 he had won a reputation as a poet with '*The Traveler*' .
- In 1766 Goldsmith revealed himself as a novelist with '*The Vicar of Wakefield*'.
- His premature death in 1774 may have been partly due to his own misdiagnosis of his kidney infection
- Goldsmith was buried in Temple Church in London. The inscription reads; "HERE LIES/OLIVER GOLDSMITH"

Neo-Classicism (18th-early 19th century)

Characteristics of Neo-Classicism:

- Reaction to the opulence of the Baroque and Rococo periods
- Coincides with the 18th century's Age of Enlightenment
- Neo-Classicism is recognizable in all media-the decorative arts, literature, painting, sculpture, theatre, and music.
- It dominates Europe and America in the second half of the 18th century.

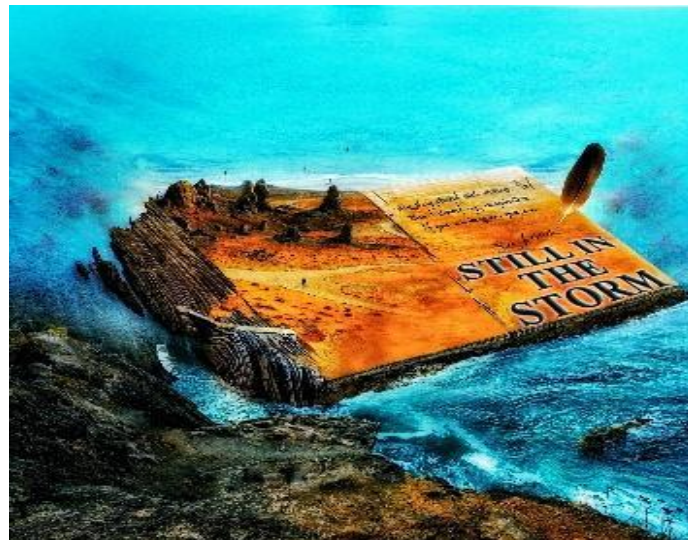
