ఈ కాలంలో యువతలో, పిల్లలలో తెలుగుభాష పట్ల ఆసక్తి తగ్గిపోతున్నది. ఇంగ్లీష్ కు ప్రాధాన్యం పెరగడం, ఆధునిక విద్యా విధానాలు, ఇంట్లో పిల్లలతో తెలుగులో కాకుండా ఇతర భాషల్లో మాట్లాడడం వంటి పరిణామాలు మన భాషను చెనుకకు నెట్టి వేస్తున్నాయి. ఫలితంగా పూర్వ కాలంలో వెలుగొందిన తెలుగు కవులు, రచయితలు, పద్య గానాలు క్రమంగా నీడలవుతున్నాయి.

Practically, it is demonstrated by forecasting various diseases with Machine Learning Models and AI technologies.

## *Highlighting the Importance of Statistical Analysis in Predicting Women's Health Risks in the Districts of Telangana*

In our empirical study based on real-time data from the National Family Health Survey-5 (2019-21), statistical inference using sophisticated machine learning models has been found crucial in interpreting and forecasting anemia risk among Telangana women. This data set with detailed socio-demographic, economic, and health-related information yields vital insights into the determinants of anemia, including education, wealth, place of residence, and health behaviors.

Using machine learning techniques such as XGBoost, Random Forest, and KNN, we could accurately predict the risks of anemia and identify intricate relationships among different risk factors. The top-performing model, XGBoost (RMSE = 1.307), yielded accurate predictions that can inform effective health interventions.

Our study identified considerable regional variations, especially among Bhadradri Kothagudem and Peddapalli districts, where socioeconomic determinants, poor nutrition, and poor access to health-care increase the risk of anemia among women. This indicates that public health programs in these areas must be prioritized if anemia causes are to be addressed and health outcomes are to be enhanced.

Our analysis reflects the capability of statistical evaluation to detect differences in health regions and develop evidence-supported suggestions for intervention that can eliminate the likelihood of anemia and increase the welfare of women in Telangana, utilizing NFHS-5 live statistics

## *Optoelectronics: Lighting The Path to the Future*


Optoelectronics merges light with electronics to create a unique field that is quietly changing the world. Unlocking your phone with facial recognition or streaming high-definition movies over fiber-optic cables are just some examples of how optoelectronics is integrated in daily life. It blends optics (light) with electronics (electric signals), resulting in devices that either emit or detect light. Although it may appear futuristic, this field is already deeply embedded into daily life as barcode scanners and sensors for autonomous vehicles use optoelectronics.

The speed, efficiency, and expediency with which optoelectronic devices can be miniaturized is what makes them desirable. They enable quicker communication via fiber optics, support green energy with solar cells, and safeguard lives with essential medical tools such as pulse oximeters and laser scalpels. Furthermore, they power smart technologies including facial recognition and precision agriculture. Light, in the same way that electricity once revolutionized society, is now driving the next big leap in technology.

The prospects for optoelectronics seem to be brilliant. Other innovations, such as bio photonic devices that detect diseases by using light signals emitted from cells, photonic chips that can replace traditional processors for faster and cooler computing, and flexible rollable screens and solar panels, will promote enhanced displays with quantum dots.

The field integrates new technologies with existing electronics systems, all while maintaining high production costs; these issues remain despite the research's promise. However, further advancements are being made in these areas.

The adoption of sustainable energy and the Internet of Things (IoT) will usher in further developments in optoelectronics. This fast-growing field of technology is redefining the sense, power, and connection to the external environment.

## *Visit to Thailand*

*A trip to Thailand was organized from 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> March, 2025, encompassing cultural, religious, and academic experiences in Bangkok and Pattaya.*











## FACULTY OF MATHEMATICS






## FACULTY OF STATISTICS

















## *Primecerious Event - Business Quiz*



## *Online Session: Empowering Educators with AI Tools*



The program enhanced financial literacy among students, villagers, and faculty. Participants gained awareness on money management, fraud prevention, and investment planning.







## *Online Faculty Development Program on Accelerate Research*












## Alumni Internship

## Internship - Media Corner






