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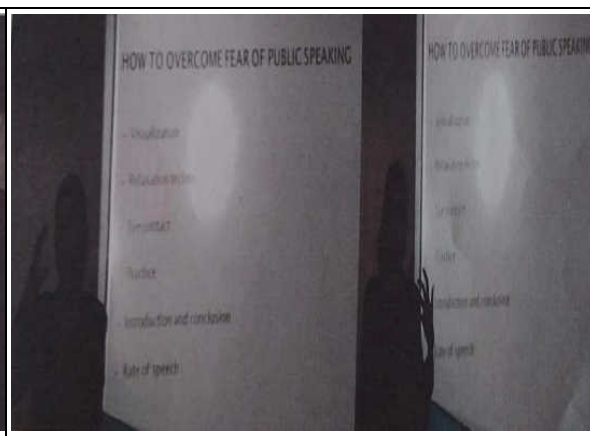
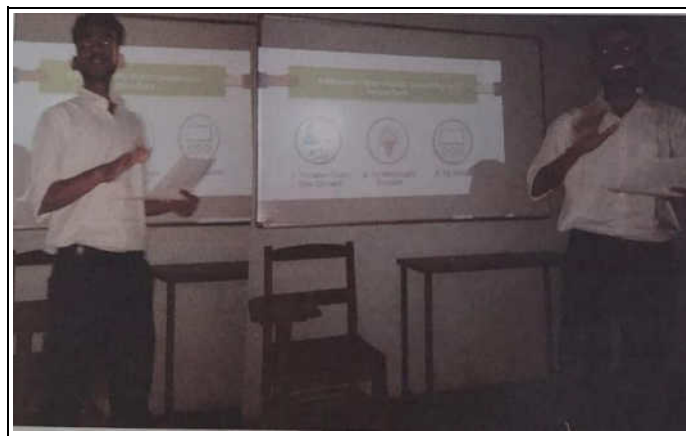

Dr. Monia spoke on “Euro-Bollywood Geographies: Trading foreignness through a data-set approach.” She spoke about the Firangi-ness in New Bollywood Cinema and the study of it through a digital humanities approach. She elaborated her lecture with examples from Bollywood movies like Hum Aapke Hein Kaun, Hum Tum etc. She clarified the concepts like identity, culture, language etc. during her lecture. While referring to the idea of relevance, she said that dates don’t mark the relevance. Her lecture continued with the quote, ‘Because the language of cinema has its own grammar’. She also quoted Salman Rushdie and Parthasarathy discussing India and its development in writing. The concept of juxtaposition was thoroughly highlighted as she was mentioning India and Italy. She also spoke on cultural heritage and cultural essentialism.

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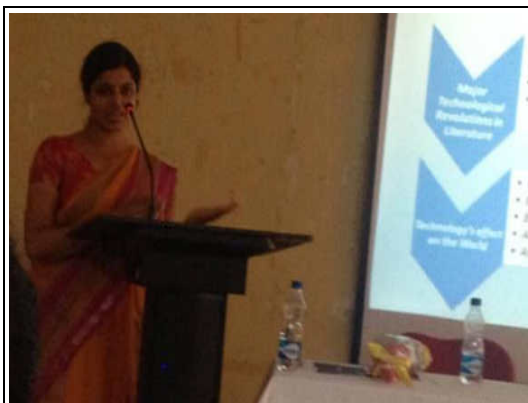

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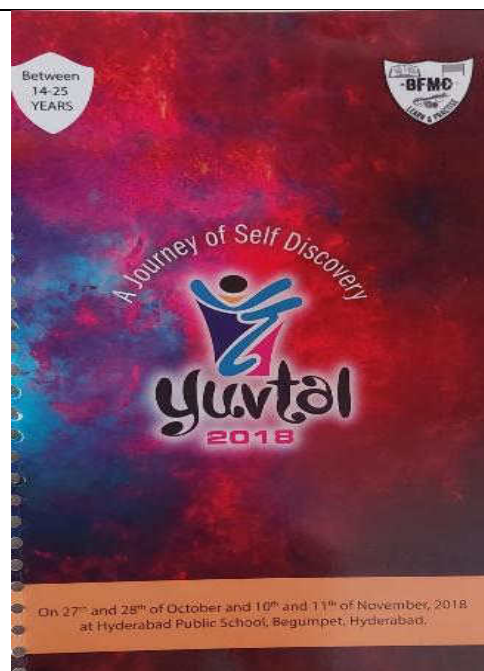
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### 8. ATTENDED: 'YUVTAL 2018' – A JOURNEY OF SELF DISCOVERY

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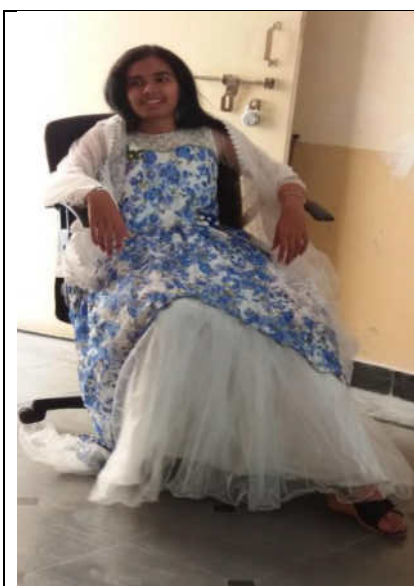

The Workshop was conducted in three sessions. In the first session Dr Mrudula introduced the topic with three modules: The First module was “Visual Interpretation” where she taught students how to decode a picture and from there on how to decode a film poster. In the second module “Brief History of World Cinema and Indian Cinema” she took the students on a visual journey from 1877 when Praxinoscope was created and showed the transition from silent to speech films and showed cinema’s arrival in India to Telugu movies of the present day. The students enjoyed as they saw clips of the very first movie ever shown to the public to the present-day movie and the evolution it has achieved.
