Date : November 17, 2021, 10:30AM



The guest speaker of the day Mr. Serish Nanisetti, explained in detail about the change in the language and the evolution of language. He explained about the variety of career options in writing and encouraged the students saying we need to read more in order to write more. Giving examples of Shakespeare's writings and J. K. Rowling's writing he said that they wrote about small facts of life, "To write is to describe experience" and they should have knowledge socially, psychologically and technologically and create jobs for themselves. The speaker cautioned the students saying that we live in a surveillance world, so he guided all the students to be alert and safe. He suggested the students to be good learners and pay 100% attention and to keep exploring the career options. He explained the power of media - "learn more, read more and write more". Language is the key to crack anything. One needs to know language, needs to know words, learn the articles and prepositions. He suggested the students to opt for many career options. Even a caption writer on social media earns more, so one must think broadly.

3. ATTENDED: PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM


Name of the Event: PDP

Topic : Professional Skills


Date : November 29 to Dec 3, 2021

Name of the Competition: Art and Articulation



5. CONDUCTED: PPT PRESENTATIONS




