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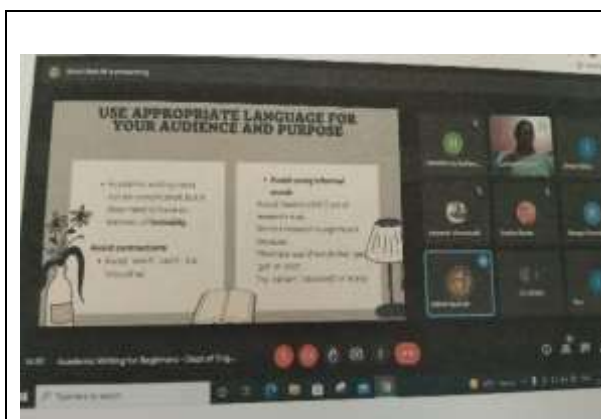
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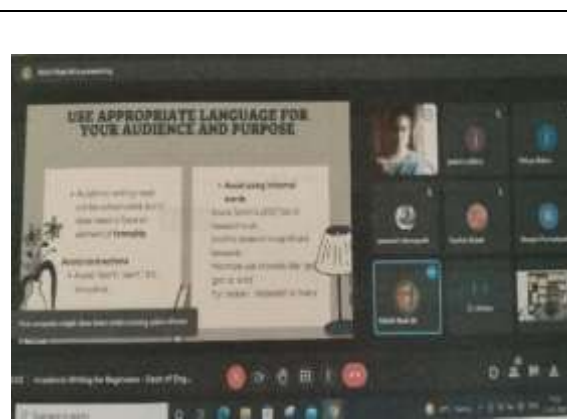
6. A Webinar on “Academic Writing for Beginners”

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9. Inter-Collegiate Competition-Text Based Drawing

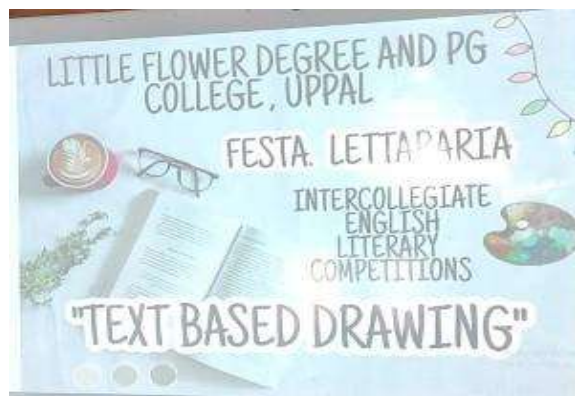
