NAME OF THE ACTIVITY: NATIONAL WEBINAR- “Racism- dimensions of racism a vantage point.”

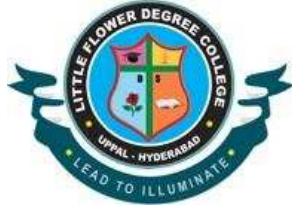

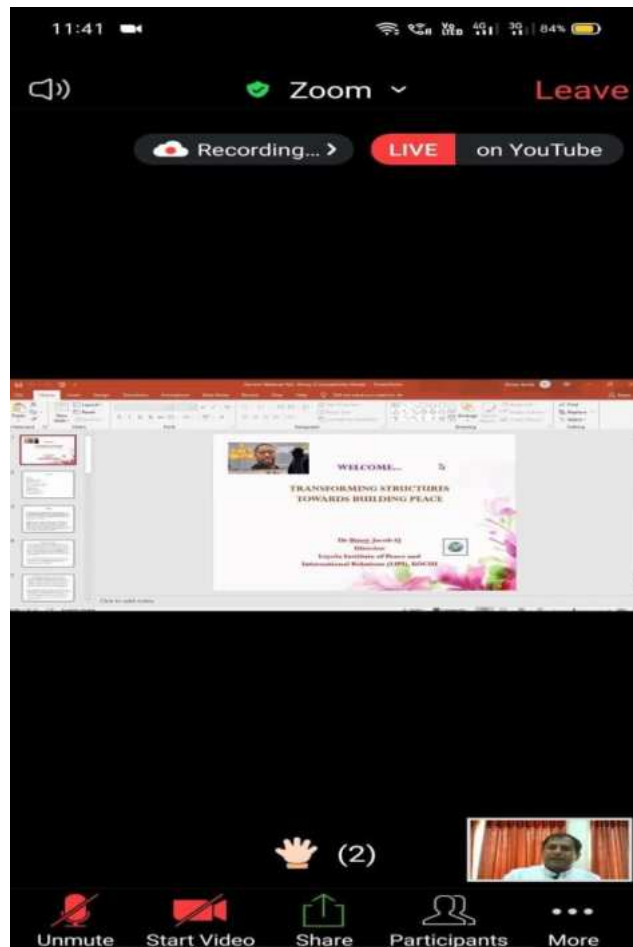
